Beach Wedding Deals

1. The "Hard Call" Timeline

The 4-Hour Rule: Decide on your final location 4 hours before guest arrival. This gives your floral and decor team enough time to reset without rushing.

The Radar Watch: Don't rely on the "Daily Forecast." Use an app like Dark Sky or Weather Underground for minute-by-minute rain start times.

2. The Logistics Pivot

Clear Umbrella Stash: Keep 20+ clear bubble umbrellas on hand. They look incredible in photos and don't block the light on your face.

The Shoe Swap: Have a pair of "Indoor Elegance" shoes ready. If the sand is wet, your heels will sink; swap to your backup pair for the indoor ceremony.

Towel Station: If guests are a little damp coming from the shuttle/parking lot, have a basket of rolled white hand towels at the indoor entrance. It's a luxury touch that shows you care.

3. The "Indoor Beauty" Strategy

Lighting Check: Natural beach light is gone. Ensure your photographer knows the "power spots" of your indoor venue (hallways, large windows, or architectural mirrors).

The Hair Pivot: If the humidity hits 80%, have your stylist do an "Up-do" transition. It keeps you looking polished even when the air is thick.

4. The Vendor Sync

The DJ/Music Shift: Ensure your musician has a "Dry Setup." Instruments and electronics can't be in even a light mist.

The Catering Flow: If the cocktail hour moves inside, ensure the "flow" doesn't get bottlenecked at the door.
